

#### Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

#### A new ministry to support our families

Since the beginning of 2023, a number of staff and parishioners have been undertaking formation to offer a new ministry for children: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

From the beginning of 2024, our parish will offer Catechesis of the Good Shepherd to children (initially, those aged 3-6 years old). The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, Australia, website explains this special ministry:

"The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Christian formation process for children aged 3 to 12 years. The central aim of this process is to help the child nurture their own personal relationship with God.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is grounded in scripture and the liturgy of the Church, then framed by Maria Montessori's principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospel through the use of sensorially rich materials. The children are free to work with these materials that represent essential proclamations of the Christian message. The adult's task is to prepare the sacred space for the children, called the Atrium, so that they can respond to this relationship first proclaimed to them through Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

The Atrium is a place of community and worship rather than a classroom for academic study. It is a place to be with and enjoy God, listen to the Word, and to pray. It is designed to reflect the beauty of creation and God's abiding love."

#### Entrance Antiphon

The Lord is truly risen, alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia.

#### Penitential Rite

Lord Jesus, you became flesh. Lord have mercy. You offer us salvation. Christ have mercy. You lead us rejoicing to the Father. Lord have mercy. *OR* 

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, *And, striking their breast, they say:* through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; Then they continue:

therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

#### <u>Gloria</u>

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

#### Nicaean Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

### Liturgy of the Word

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must Alleluia, alleluia! have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all Gospel who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did It was very early on the first day of the week and still throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten him." and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead.
