Dear friends,

When you read this I will be visiting Mt Nebo and crossing into Israel. Know that you are in my prayers during this time of pilgrimage with the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre. Next week I will share with you the highlights of the pilgrimage. I carry with me your name and the names of the young people from our preschool and schools.

I'd like to mention the important area of safeguarding in our parish. Ruth and Michelle in the parish office co ordinate the safeguarding requirements of our volunteers and ensure that people are kept safe. This means risk assessments must be done for parish events with children, some volunteers need a Working With Children Check (WWCC) and must do the online safeguarding training run by the Archdiocese. In last years audit the parish received 90% rating. It is extremely important that if you are involved in particular ministries that involves WWCC and training that it is done within a reasonable time frame. Ministry and serving God in 2023 means that we must take seriously safeguarding requirements. Legally I am responsible for any breach.

Last week I provided some feedback from our finance meeting. I would like to add the very important point that the parish is in a good financial situation. Our financial strategies and planning process have improved and we now look to maintain and grow our mission. Last week I also used the word 'fundraiser'. The focus of this activity is funds. But I should have used 'community-raiser' which puts the focus not on the funds but on creating community. As interest rates increase I understand that many families find it difficult. Some families may be doing ok. Whatever the case the parish is grateful for your time and talent.

Bookings are now being taken for our Annual Parish Dinner!



Mt Carmel Place

Sydney City Council is proposing to name the private road that runs from Kellick Street in front of the church in Waterloo Park, Mount Carmel Place.

The name recognises the long historical association of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church and School with the communities of Waterloo. The school and church have provided educational facilities and a place of worship to the local community since the 1850s.

In 2021 the parish priest requested that the road be officially named. The road provides access to the rear of the school and the priest's residence. It is important it's officially named to ensure it's easy for emergency services to find.


Council resolved at its meeting on 27 March 2023 to seek community feedback on the proposed name. This is the first step in officially naming the road.

In line with Geographical Names Board of NSW policies, we're proposing to name the road Mount Carmel Place instead of Mount Carmel Way.

Gospel Reflection

The readings for the last few Sundays have been about the Resurrection, but today's Gospel takes us back in time to an event in Jesus' life before his Passion. Jesus tells his disciples that he is going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises that where he is going, his disciples will be able to follow. Thomas, who will later doubt the disciples' reports that they have seen the Risen Lord, contradicts Jesus by saying that the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains that he himself is the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples now love God the Father.

Philip then makes a request that challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show the Father to the disciples. Recall that Jesus has just told his disciples, "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." As a good teacher, Jesus responds to Philip by repeating and elaborating on what he has just told the disciples: they have seen and known Jesus, so they have seen and known the Father. Then Jesus offers another reassurance about his departure: because of faith in God and in Jesus, the disciples will do the work that Jesus has done and more.

The connection between Jesus and his Father, between Jesus' work and the work of the Father, is made clear in today's Gospel. Jesus is in the Father, and God the Father is in Jesus. As God spoke his name to Moses, "I am," so too Jesus speaks his name to his disciples: "I am the way and the truth and the life."

The revelation of the Trinity is completed in the passage that follows today's reading, and it is the Gospel for next Sunday. Because Jesus goes away, the Father will send in Jesus' name the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will continue the work of the Father and of Jesus.

Liturgy of the Word

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and A reading from the holy Gospel according to John continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service Jesus said to his disciples: of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of Trust in God still, and trust in me. the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

The Lord is the living stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him; set yourselves close to him so that you too, the holy priesthood that offers the spiritual sacrifices which Jesus Christ has made acceptable to God, may be living stones making a spiritual house. As scripture says: See how I lay in Zion a believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other precious cornerstone that I have chosen and the man who rests his trust on it will not be disappointed. That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because he will perform even greater works, they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store because I am going to the Father.' for them.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises

of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.
