Greeting from Jerusalem where for the last week I've been on pilgrimage with 15 others. Walking in the footsteps of Christ is bringing alive the gospels. The Old Testament records the story of Israel and how they walked from slavery into the promised land. The book of Psalms particularly recounts in poetic style, the ups and downs of walking. But the Israelites knew that in their walking God was close to them. The Gospels record the journey of Jesus. We are visiting many places that remind us that God continues to walk with his people. The pilgrimage has been organised by the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre, and for some of the pilgrims visiting places that the order continues to support is very inspiring.

Later today, the group will meet with the Latin patriarch to open a youth centre, which the order has funded and I will also receive from the Patriarch , the Pilgrim Shell.



Mt Carmel Place

Sydney City Council is proposing to name the private road that runs from Kellick Street in front of the church in Waterloo Park, Mount Carmel Place.

The name recognises the long historical association of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church and School with the communities of Waterloo. The school and church have provided educational facilities and a place of worship to the local community since the 1850s.

In 2021 the parish priest requested that the road be officially named. The road provides access to the rear of the school and the priest's residence. It is important it's officially named to ensure it's easy for emergency services to find.

Council resolved at its meeting on 27 March 2023 to seek community feedback on the proposed name. This is the first step in officially naming the road.

In line with Geographical Names Board of NSW policies, we're proposing to name the road Mount Carmel Place instead of Mount Carmel Way.

Project Good Samaritan - *non-perishable food items* for toddlers and children.

As we head into winter and with the rising cost of living, St Vincent's De Paul has experienced a significant increase in families reaching out for food support. Unfortunately, this increase in requests has meant that the pantry stock of food suitable for toddlers and children has diminished, and they have been unable to replenish stock to support the volume of requests.

So, for the next three months, our Parish will dedicate our Project Good Samaritan efforts to collecting *non-perishable food items for toddlers and children*.

Items for donation may include:

Breakfast cereals, long-life milk and dairy products, school lunch spreads and snacks, pasta/rice, quick meals such as spaghetti/macaroni and cheese, canned fruit, and small juice drinks.

These items can be left in the hampers at the back of the church and will be collected weekly.



Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel is a continuation of last week's Gospel: Jesus is speaking to his disciples at the Last Supper. In today's reading Jesus offers encouragement to his disciples, who will soon see him crucified. He reassures them that even though he will leave them, he will not abandon them. Instead he will send them the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, through whom the disciples will continue to live in union with Jesus.

Jesus uses the term Advocate to describe the Holy Spirit, whom the disciples will receive. Another word used to describe the Holy Spirit is Paraclete, a legal term meaning "one who offers defense for another." Note that Jesus says that he will send "another Advocate." Jesus himself is the first advocate, interceding for his disciples with the Father.

In today's reading Jesus contrasts his impending departure with the permanence of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will leave to return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples.

Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will come to know and appreciate the unity of the Son and the Father. They will also understand that they too participate in the communion between the Father and the Son: "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20).

Today's reading is one example of the contrast that John's Gospel presents between the community of disciples, to whom God will reveal himself, and the unbelieving world, which will remain in darkness. The unbelieving world cannot accept the "Spirit of truth," whom the disciples will receive. Only through the Spirit will God's revelation and love be known.

Nicaean Creed

I believe in one God. the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the to life. Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard Gospel Acclamation of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for Alleluia, alleluia! themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that All who love me will keep my words, came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and and my Father will love them and we will come to them. several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result Alleluia! there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had Gospel accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to A reading from the holy Gospel according to John them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Jesus said to his disciples: Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had 'If you love me you will keep my commandments. not come down on any of them: they had only been I shall ask the Father, baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid and he will give you another Advocate hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In

the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised

to be with you for ever, that Spirit of truth whom the world can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him; but you know him, because he is with you, he is in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you. In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you. Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'
