Dear friends,

This Sunday we return to Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. As we return to Ordinary Time we try to make this time extraordinary by being open to the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit which draws us all into a relationship of love and communion. Our window into understanding God as Father, Son and Spirit is through Jesus who reveals the Father as creator and the Spirit as Advocate.

In the Catholic Church in Alice Springs is this window, designed by Kathleen Kemarre Wallace, and is called 'Urtakwerte Atywerrenge Anthurre', meaning 'Very Sacred Heart'. Ms Wallace was 13 years-old when she started at Santa Teresa where she was taught the Bible. "When I went to Santa Teresa, nuns taught me the Bible. When I came to Santa Teresa I couldn't speak English — I learned it there," she said.

"[Catholicism and my family's traditional beliefs] are similar — it wasn't hard for me. "I realised later when the Sisters of the Sacred Heart read to us from the Bible, it was like the Trinity, Father our creator, Son and Holy Spirit". "My grandfather's ancestors gave him a



dream of three circles — grandfather, father and totem spirit — like the Holy Trinity." Kathllen Said (Quotes from The Catholic Weekly 2019).

The Trinity draws us all into deeper communion with God and with one another. The Trinity is a challenge to seek reconciliation and deeper hospitality.

At 1:15pm Sunday 11 June our parish will be joining every other parish in Sydney to pilgrimage with Jesus in the Eucharist through the streets of Sydney from Pitt St to the Cathedral in the Annual Walk with **Christ** procession. By doing so we will be entering into an over 800-year old tradition of accompanying Jesus, held up high by the Archbishop, through the streets of our city, interceding for all the poor, suffering and anguished of our city, as well as bringing our own special big intentions. The parish is providing a free 28-seat bus from and back to St Joseph's Rosebery, so transport will be a cinch. We will also have our own parish banner to highlight to all the marchers and media that our parish is marching. The bus departs St Joseph's Rosebery at 1:15pm sharp, and at the end of the afternoon will leave St Mary's Cathedral at 4:45pm to bring us back to Rosebery. Marchers are encouraged to bring a bottle of water, something for the wind, something for the rain, a hat, your rosary beads - and a joyful heart! 

Australian Catholic Bishops Statement on Indigenous Voice to Parliament

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia's bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart – the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their plenary meeting in Sydney this week, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

While the bishops – based on a decision they took in May 2022 – will later this year issue their annual Social Justice Statement on the place of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in Australian society, they decided to issue a statement at this point in the referendum process.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn't mentioned in the Constitution is "an omission which needs to be rectified".

A Voice to Parliament isn't the only way to achieve that outcome, the bishops wrote, but it "is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru".

"This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia," the statement says.

"We want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.

"This is an important moment in the history of the nation, and it can help us to move towards a deep and just reconciliation. It also offers a mechanism to improve the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples."

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that "people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives".

"We are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a high-quality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples," they wrote.

"We ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population."

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year.

The bishops encouraged Catholic parishes, schools and agencies to arrange opportunities for people to read the document and have discussions about their response to its key messages.

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next, however, are designated as solemnities—special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today on Trinity Sunday we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, one God in three persons.

Today's Gospel is from the beginning of John's Gospel. The passage we read follows Jesus' conversation with a Pharisee, Nicodemus, about what it means to be born of both water and the spirit. Nicodemus approaches Jesus at night and acknowledges Jesus as a teacher from God. Jesus tells him that only those who are born from above Kingdom of God. will the Nicodemus misunderstands and questions how a person can be born more than once. Jesus tells Nicodemus that no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. Jesus is essentially explaining Baptism, which we celebrate as a sacrament today. Yet Nicodemus, we are told, still does not understand what Jesus is saying. Jesus continues by testifying to the need to be born from above so that one might have eternal life.

After the dialogue with Nicodemus, the author of the Gospel offers his own explanation of Jesus' words. This is what we read in today's Gospel, John 3:16-18.

In the context of today's focus on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, the reading calls our attention to the action of God, who reveals himself in three persons: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but acts to save it.

The Gospel also calls attention to the response that is required of us. God's love for us calls us to respond in faith by professing our belief in God's son, Jesus, and the salvation that he has won for us. This profession of faith is a sign of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
