
















#### Parish Dinner 2023

The redevelopment of the Eileen O'Connor Museum has reached an exciting milestone. The museum is fully planned and we are waiting on approval from the Randwick council to commence construction. The museum has been designed in an open plan to allow visitors to engage with the story of Eileen O'Connor, Fr McGrath and Our Lady's Nurses on multiple levels. The narrative of the museum interprets significant events in Eileen's life, the struggles and victories she experienced, the determination of the nurses to continue her vision, through to current ministries. This means people of all ages and interest will be able to relate to the story of Eileen and assimilate that, which was so important to her, into their own lives. The museum will become part of the ongoing legacy of Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor. Although the museum is closed, the Sisters still welcome visitors anytime between 9.30 am and 12 noon and from 1 pm to 3.30 pm, Monday to Friday, with prior booking. #### Remembering Mum Shirl - Redfern Hero

Last Monday saw the list of the recipients of the Kings list of honours for exceptional Australians. One local identity that has been immortalised as a hero and respected community member was Mum Shirl. You can see her statue beside the Redfern church. The follow comes from an article written by Fr Ross Jones SJ about the great Australian and Redfern identity.

"Mum Shirley was a national treasure – a title given to her, in fact, by the National Trust in her lifetime. Such a prominent Aboriginal Australian and activist committed to justice and the welfare of Aboriginal Australians."

'Mum' Shirl was, in her core, a woman of great faith. She was an integral and committed part of the Catholic Church of St Vincent's, Redfern, working alongside the legendary Fr Ted Kennedy. Though Shirley was a devout Catholic, one of her favourite observations was, "There's nothing out of plumb with the Catholic religion; it's the way Catholics practise it!" Father Kennedy said of her: "She comforted the afflicted – but she didn't promise not to afflict the comfortable". Shirley Smith was a social conscience. Our world needs people like her to challenge, provoke and question – and that is at the heart of our Jesuit formation here. We can learn from her.

'Mum' Shirl also spent considerable time and money finding homes for children whose parents could not look after them and helping displaced children to find their own parents again. Children with nowhere to go often ended up living with her. By the early 1990s she had raised over 60 children. Really a 'Mum' in so many ways. Likewise, many people with no family or friends in Sydney arrived at 'Mum' Shirl's Redfern house seeking shelter. There she lived those core gospel values — "When I was hungry and thirsty, you fed me; when I was naked you clothed me; when I was sick you cared for me."

With a First Australians focus, it could be to welcome the outcomes of the Uluru Statement from the Heart, to welcome the freedom that comes with truth-telling of our nation's history. To embrace a real freedom that would allow us to arrive at a national Makaratta, a reconciliation, or a treaty.

#### **Gospel Reflection**

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples. Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word apostle when referring to the Twelve. The word apostle means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.© Loyola Press

#### Nicaean Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows: Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.'
