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Dear friends,

Lord, Save me!

This most striking line in todays Gospel reminds me that without the Lord I will sink. We often sink when we give into the temptation of *spiritual worldliness* as Pope Francis calls it. "Spiritual worldliness, which hides behind the appearance of piety consists in seeking not the Lord's glory but human glory and personal well-being." I will talk more about this in my homily this week. By invoking once again the words of St Peter, "Lord, save me", we are intentionally asking God to help

us live our faith and religion with a deeper sense of fidelity and authenticity that goes beyond mere appearances and is grounded in giving glory to God. When we align our hearts and minds to the Lord our focus will always be to praise God through the way we live our life.

We need to look precisely to Jesus, to the compassion with which He sees our wounded humanity, to the gratuitousness with which He offered His life for us on the cross. Here is the daily antidote to worldliness...: to look at the crucified Jesus, to fix our eyes every day on He who emptied Himself and humbled Himself unto death (cf. Phil 2:7-8). He accepted humiliation to raise us up from our falls and to free us from the power of evil. In this way, looking at Jesus' wounds, looking at Him humbled, we learn that we are called to offer ourselves, to make ourselves broken bread for the hungry, to share the journey with the weary and oppressed. 


FY2023 Tax Receipts

Over the past 9 months we have worked together to restart our hospitality ministry. Thanks be to God, there are now 30-40 hospitality volunteers in our parish.

Hospitality is a very important ministry for Christians. Jesus called his disciples his friends, and he ate and drank with them often. Our morning teas are a wonderful time to give real friendship and fellowship to each other, and also welcome others. You never know how you may brighten someone's life by your presence, someone who really needs it.

Despite having a great team, we can still use your help! Many hands make light work so the more we have involved, the easier and more smoothly it runs. You don't have to be able to cook to do this ministry. You can:

- Help set up
- Serve tea and coffee
- Invite individual Mass-goers to our catch ups and show them the way to the venue
- Serve food
- Be an intentional host, who looks out for new people or people who are on their own, to make sure they feel welcome by chatting with them or introducing them to others
- Help clean-up and pack-up
- For those who love to cook or buy food, we absolutely need your contribution too. You can sign up once or as many times as you like to bring food.
- Help to make or bring gluten free foods for those with gluten intolerances and allergies.
- Donate food which will not spoil such as long-life milk, children's juice boxes, or cakes/biscuits with long expiration dates.

Frequently asked questions

How often do I have to volunteer?

It's up to you. We have a roster. We just ask that you commit to a date so we know we have your help that day.

Can I change dates if something comes up?

Absolutely. Someone on the roster will swap months with you.

Do I have to go on the roster?


No, but it is more helpful because then we know what help we have. It also ensures we have enough food and, conversely, that we don't waste food by having too much.

Today's Gospel directly follows last week's account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter 8 of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. In continuity with last week's Gospel about the feeding of the multitude, today's Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. In last week's Gospel, when the disciples see the crowds, they ask Jesus to send the crowds away. Jesus turns the situation around, telling the disciples to feed the crowd with the provisions that they have. Both of these Gospels tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The five loaves and two fish feed a multitude of people. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son. Last Sunday Fr Paul blessed the new icon of Our Lady Queen of Heaven which hangs in the Adoration chapel at Rosebery. It was a particular delight to welcome the artist Michael Galovic. Fr Paul in conjunction with Michael Galovic has produced a brochure about the spirituality of the icon.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'
