Dear friends,

"Listening" has been the central lesson highlighted throughout our journey in Matthew's Gospel, from a Sunday to a Sunday: Listening to the Word on the mountain (Mt 17:1-9), the Word in the storm (Mt 14:22-33) and last Sunday we saw that there is also a Word for the foreign woman, who is also called to finally hear the Word (Mt 15:21-28). Listening to the Word is also central to today's passage (Mt 16:13-20): We are still in a pagan land, where divinity has many faces, many names, many voices, making it hard to listen. In this context, Jesus asks his disciples a question to see what they heeded and what they understood about what they heard, how the Word they heard led to knowledge, and specifically to a relationship. For this is the purpose of listening: To grow in the relationship that sustains them, the relationship with Him. This is what Jesus cares about.

On Monday the State Government announced a proposal to redevelop the south end of the Waterloo Estate. The Premier choose Waterloo Park, right in front of the church, to make this announcement. After the press conference the Premier and Ron Hoenig, our local member, stopped to say hello and asked to look inside the church. It was great to chat with the Premier and the local member.

The redevelopment poses a great opportunity to renew this area. I do not want to get into any of the political debate on this matter. Rather, I see this project as an opportunity to support the most vulnerable by providing housing that supports the dignity of the human person. Over the years I have visited the sick and housebound in these flats. I am always horrified by the undignified condition of these places. This is not to say some are ok, but many are not. As a local resident, I also support any attempt to create a safer environment to live, learn and worship. The parish stands ready to support our parishioners involved in any way. I urge the Government to communicate in a caring and sensitive way as we make this transition.

Gospel Refection

It is important to read today's Gospel and next week's Gospel as two parts of a single story. These readings are a turning point in Matthew's Gospel. This week we hear Jesus name Simon Peter as the rock upon which he will build his Church. Next week we will hear Jesus call this same Simon Peter "Satan" when he reacts negatively to Jesus' prediction about his passion and death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about his identity. The disciples indicate that most people believe that Jesus is a prophet of Israel. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they believe that he is. Simon Peter answers, identifying Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter will play an important role in the early Christian community as a spokesperson and a leader.

In today's Gospel, Peter's recognition of Jesus' identity is credited to a revelation by God. This will contrast sharply with Jesus' rebuke of Peter in next week's Gospel. When Peter rejects Jesus' prediction of his passion and death, Peter is said to no longer be thinking as God does but as humans do.

The use of the term church in today's Gospel is one of only three such occurrences in Matthew's Gospel. Peter in this Gospel is being credited as the foundation for the Church, a privilege granted to him because of his recognition of Jesus' identity. The Church continues to be grounded in the faith that Jesus Christ is Lord. PRAYER FOR MISSION

Entrance Antiphon

Nicaean Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.
