

Jesus is portraying this image of God, the landowner in our story, as simply being extremely generous. His ways are not our ways. His generosity goes far beyond our sense of generosity and justice. If God's ways seem disconcerting or even unfair to us at first, they are ultimately very reassuring. The parable suggests that God does not relate to us according to strict justice, but that for each of us the thrill of divine generosity is available through boundless grace. And that is maybe also what today's reading is about, for us to allow something of God's ways to shape our ways, so that we too may relate to others not on the basis of strict justice but out of the generosity of our heart.

Model vestments

Can you use your skills to serve God by supporting children's ministry in our parish?

We are currently making items for a Children's Atrium. This is a place where children can grow in their relationship with God and learn about their faith.

The materials we use in the Atrium are a very important part of the catechesis.



Cloths for prayer table

Examples of some of the materials we need to make include:

- small models of houses that we use to illuminate certain Bible narratives such as the Last Supper, the Annunciation, the parable of the pearl of great price
- aprons of certain colours for the children to use while painting or doing other activities in the Atrium
- altar cloths for our model altar, and cloths or our prayer table
- a mini-vestment set for a presentation to the children on the vestments of the priest

Please don't make the items yet as they need to be made using particular colours, dimensions and materials. These are laid out in a Materials Manual for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, which I will provide to those helping out.

If you are interested in helping by making one or two items, please get in contact with me. The Atrium begins next year so you won't have to rush to make your items.



In today's Gospel, Jesus moves from Galilee to teach in Judea where he is sought out by great crowds and tested by the Pharisees on issues such as marriage and divorce. Jesus also encounters a rich young man who is unable to accept Jesus' demand that he leave his possessions to follow him. Jesus' response to the rich young man sounds very much like the conclusion we will find in today's Gospel: the first will be last and the last will be first.

On the surface, the parable of the workers in the vineyard appears to be an offense to common sense. Those who work a longer day ought to be paid more than those who work just an hour or two. When viewed in this way, the landowner seems unfair. That is because we are reading into the parable our own preconceived notions of how fairness and equality should be quantified.

A close read shows us that the landowner paid on the terms that were negotiated. The landowner, it seems, has acted completely justly. The parable goes beyond that, however, and we come to see that the landowner is not simply just, he is exceptionally just. He is radically just. He has given those who labored in the field for a full day their due pay. But he has also given a full-day's wage to those who worked only a single hour. No one is cheated, but a few receive abundantly from the landowner just as we receive from God more than what is merely justifiable or due. God, like the landowner, is radically just and abundantly generous. The workers who complain are made to look foolish as they lament the fact that landowner has made all workers equal. Indeed, what more could one ask for than to be treated as an equal at work or anywhere else?


The parable reminds us that although God owes us nothing, he offers abundantly and equally. We are occasionally tempted to think that our own actions deserve more reward, more of God's abundant mercy, than the actions of others. But God's generosity cannot be quantified or partitioned into different amounts for different people. When we think that way, we are trying to relate to God on our terms rather than to accept God's radically different ways.



Next week if you come to Our Lady of Mt Carmel as you drive up Gibbon Street you will be greeted by this beautiful arch above the front gate. As part of the heritage restoration program it was discovered that there was originally a metal arch or overthrow above the gate. The metal worker injured himself and the project has taken some time to complete. Furthermore, the metal arch also acts as a further security measure. I thank David Fleming for his work. Fr Paul worked with David on the design based on the heritage of the site.

Redfern Church security

As part of the parish building security update, Redfern church security upgrade is now complete with CCTV as well as electronic fob readers for access (the other two churches were completed in 2021 and 2022). Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you Christ will be glorified in my body, whether by my life or have treated them the same as us, though we have done a them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own?
