On Friday, 17 November, Archbishop Anthony Fisher will host a free luncheon for Sydney's homeless in the forecourt of St Mary's Cathedral from 12 pm to 2 pm. A large number of guests are expected and volunteers from parishes are invited to help serve food and to sit and accompany guests during lunch. The Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd have begun auditing dioceses and parishes around Australia. Our parish has been selected to be audited. Ruth and Michelle will assist me in completing the rather complex process ACSL requires. The process involves completing an online self assessment this month followed by an in-person visit next year. I am happy to report that since my time as parish priest the safeguarding requirements have been significantly improved and complied with and we now have the documents the ACSL require for evidence. In the last self assessment the parish received an excellent rating. This includes, those volunteers who have been mandated to provide a Working With Children Check and online training are up to date. Risk assessments are completed where appropriate, clergy training is completed twice a year, Code of Conduct is signed by those who require it, a Safeguarding link to all resources can be found on our parish website, newsletter notices published, yearly self assessment completed.

The Synod in Rome has now finished it's first session. A synthesis report has been published. This report is not Church teaching but a record of the discussions of the participants and proposals for further discussion with the local Churches. I encourage you to read the report and I'm sure in time we will have an opportunity to offer feedback. The report offers an honest and challenging picture of what happened in the Synod room.

The final stage of the redevelopment of Our Lady of Mt Carmel will take place starting 8 January 2024. In previous newsletters I have outlined the scope of work and how it is important and necessary to more fully comply with the Liturgical documents outlined in Vatican II and the Australian Catholic Bishops directory. Waterloo church will be closed from 8 January for six weeks. All Masses usually held at Mt Carmel will be held at Rosebery. I have invited Archbishop Anthony to celebrate Mass to consecrate the new altar and church after it has been completed.

Please note I am away this week and there will be a Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion on Monday and Wednesday at 7.30am at St Jospeh Rosebery. God bless,

A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney:

Gospel Reflection

Every year the Church recalls the example, witness, and prayer of the holy women and men who have been identified by the Church as Saints. These saints are more than just role models; they are family members with whom we continue to share relation, in a bond of prayer, called the Communion of Saints. Every year when we celebrate this day, the Gospel we proclaim recalls for us Jesus' teaching about happiness, the Beatitudes. We quickly note in this reading that none of those Jesus names as "blessed" or "happy" are expected . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.

What does Jesus mean when he uses the word "blessed?" This word is sometimes translated as "happy" or "fortunate" or "favoured." In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favour is upon those who are poor, who mourn, who are persecuted. This might have been welcome and surprising news to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Because of this, it is natural that we proclaim this Gospel on the Feast of All Saints. Saints are people who lived the spirit of the Beatitudes as Jesus lived. On this day, we too are challenged to model our lives on the spirit and promises of the Beatitudes.

Parish Pastoral Council Report

The PPC met on Thursday 26 October at Waterloo.

The PPC received a report and gave feedback to me on the following:

• Renovation plans for Waterloo parish centre

Discussion on plans for the renovation of parish centre at Waterloo (formerly school admin). Hall capacity for 100, small office/breakout area, kitchen and upstairs meeting space.

• Waterloo church phase 3 works

This includes the sanctuary works approved by the Liturgical Commission and Sydney City Council. The works address the clutter and enable it to comply with the Liturgical Documents. The start date is January 8 2024. The church will be closed for six weeks. All Masses will be transferred to Rosebery during this time. Archbishop Anthony has been invited to consecrate new altar and church after completion.

• Schools update

Marg Holles (OLMC) was an apology but it was noted a new before and after school care provider was found for 2024. NAPLAN results were encouraging, discussions about improvements to school and site.

Bernard Ryan (St J) discussed the progress of construction. Kindergarten enrolments for next year stand at 69. Foundation Dinner held on Fri 3 November.

Pastoral Associate for Mission

Elizabeth outlined the pastoral activities she coordinates including starting the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd in 2024, parish retreat, prayer text line and pastoral support.

Pastoral Associate

Sr Rosemary gave a brief report on the areas she coordinates such as catechists, sacramental program, and care for the sick.

Proposals

That tap and go figures as well as cash received in collection be published each week or once a month. It was noted that Archdiocesan policy is not to publish money received for security reasons. However, Fr Paul considers it appropriate unless directly ordered by the Archdiocese to publish monthly figures. As there is a risk in doing this Fr Paul will monitor.

The next gathering is for all parishioners at the parish Christmas Party after 5pm Vigil Mass on Saturday 2 December.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well. Let me remind you, brothers, how hard we used to work, slaving night and day so as not to be a burden on any one of you while we were proclaiming God's Good News to you.

Another reason why we constantly thank God for you is that as soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi.

You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'
