All people are invited to embrace the spirit of the Jubilee by becoming 'Pilgrims of Hope' and stepping out in faith to receive the graces offered by God at this favourable time.

What is a Jubilee?

The word Jubilee is derived form the Hebrew word 'yobel' which means 'ram's horn'. It was used to herald "a year of the Lord's favour" (Isaiah 61:1-2), when slaves were emancipated, lands restored to their original owners, and debts forgiven (Leviticus 25:10).

Pope Boniface VII proclaimed the first Jubilee in 1300, and since then Church has adopted the practice of celebrating jubilees or holy years as times of repentance, special blessings, prayer and pilgrimage.

The Eternal City

The Vatican and the city of Rome are expecting to welcome a steady stream of pilgrims to the Eternal City for the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope.

A Jubilee calendar of events in the city of Rome will mark various jubilees celebrating and giving thanks for all aspects of humanity. Events will include the Jubilee of health care workers, artists, sports, families, priests, religious life, consecrated life, education, the poor, grandparents and the elderly, to name just a few.

The Jubilee begins with the opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome on 24 December 2024 and concludes when the Holy Door is sealed on the Feast of the Epiphany (6 January 2026).





Dear Friends,

Pope Francis has launched a 'Year of Prayer' as the Church prepares to celebrate a Jubilee Year in 2025. The last major Jubilee was celebrated in the Year 2000. Fr John Knight and myself will be leading a Jubilee Pilgrimage to Italy after Easter next year. The Pilgrimage will start in Milan followed by Venice, Turin (Shroud of Turin), Venice, Florence, Ravenna (early church mosaics) and Rome with a day trip to Assisi. Harvest Pilgrimages are putting together the itinerary and we will know costs before Easter this year. I hope some of you may join Fr John and myself as we prayerfully enter into this Jubilee Pilgrimage. The highlight will be to pass through the Holy Doors of each major Basilica in Rome and celebrate Mass at St Peter's.

It was a delight to welcome the new kindy students and their parents this week to our schools. Sr Rosemary and I welcomed the 70 new kindy's at St Jospeh's. My thanks to Bernard Ryan and staff for the excellent welcome. Despite a few tears (from students and parents) we look forward to making this journey with our students, staff and parents of both our schools.

Last week I launched the Parish **Year of Joy**. Our focus for this year as we welcome new friends and deepen connections is to nurture a spirituality of Joy. JOY could stand for J– Jesus, O-others, Y– Yourself. Let us pray for the grace to 'rejoice in the Lord always' (Phil 4:4)

The Rosebery site with our new preschool and primary school together with the renovations to the church has considered green energy and strategies to minimise our footprint on the planet. 67% of the power generated on the site comes from solar. While the design of the buildings maximise airflow so that air conditioning use is reduced. All buildings use LED lights and maximise the connection with the existing trees enabling cooler buildings. The school and pre school have greater capacity for solar panels in the future. The use of renewal energy is consistent with Papal teaching in Laudato Si 'There is an urgent need to develop policies so that, in the next few years, the emission of carbon dioxide and other highly polluting gases can be drastically reduced, for example, substituting for fossil fuels and developing sources of renewable energy. Worldwide there is minimal access to clean and renewable energy.' (26)



National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL) is a national organisation established in 2020 with the purpose of promoting and overseeing a consistent approach to the practice of Safeguarding in our Church. The mandate of ACSL is "to support Church leaders and Catholic organisations to create safe and nurturing environments for every person who comes into contact with the Church in Australia". (ACSL Annual Report 2021-2022).

The ACSL has developed ten National Catholic Safeguarding Standards which incorporate recommendations from the Royal Commission and also the National Principals for Child Safe Organisations, contextualising these requirements for the Catholic Church in Australia. These standards work in conjunction to ensure every entity, ministry, and organisation across the Catholic Church in Australia places the safety of children and adults at risk at the core of how they plan, think and act. Over the coming weeks we will review each standard and how they function within our community. As always if you have feedback please contact us at safeguarding@citysouthcatholic.org.au.

Standard One: Committed Leadership, Governance and Culture

At both the local level of our Parish and within our Archdiocese our leadership promotes and influences a positive/active Safeguarding culture. There is the expectation of zero tolerance to abuse and all people (children and adults) are provided a safe environment free from abuse and discrimination. Our Parish operates in line with the Archdiocesan Safeguarding Policy, staff and requisite volunteers all undertake regular training and all have signed and agreed to a code of conduct which sets clear behavioural standards towards adults and children. We strive to promote Safeguarding in our parish, ensure our community is educated and informed and we plan all our events and activities with this in mind.
