Dear Friends,

We have begun the season of Lent. This sacred time of preparation for Easter lasts for forty days. The forty-day period of Jesus' trial in the desert echoes a number of events in the Old Testament:

- •The face of the earth was cleansed and purified during the promised period of days and nights that rain poured down during the great flood—"I will bring rain down on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and so I will wipe out from the surface of the earth every moving creature that I have made" (Gen 7:4).
- •The face of the earth was renewed during a fortyday period after the mountain tops appeared and the waters of the great flood receded—"The tops of the mountains appeared. At the end of forty days Noah opened the hatch of the ark that he had made" (Gen 8:5-6).
- •Moses spent forty years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery—"Moses fled when he heard this and settled as an alien in the land of Midian . . . Forty years later, an angel appeared to him in the desert near Mount Sinai in the flame of a burning bush" (Acts 7: 29-30).
- •Moses fasted for forty days and nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tablets of the covenant— "So Moses stayed there with the Lord for forty days and forty nights, without eating any food or drinking any water, and he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the ten commandments" (Ex 34:28).
- •The Israelites spent forty years wandering in the desert, as a time of testing, trial and purification of the people, before reaching the Promised Land— "Now the Israelites had wandered forty years in the desert, until all the warriors among the people that came forth from Egypt died off because they had not obeyed the command of the Lord" (Jos 5:6; see Num 32:13).
- •The prophet Elijah spent forty days in the desert before encountering God on Mount Horeb—"[Elijah] got up, ate and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb" (1 Kgs 19:8).
- •The Ninevites were given forty days before God was going to destroy the city, allowing time for repentance and conversion—"Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, 'Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed,' when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth" (Jon 3:4-5).




Good Samaritan Project - Easter



Great Reads for Lent

Are you looking for some spiritual reading for Lent? Check out these titles:

Mere Christianity by C.S. Lewis

A reasoned defence of Christianity. Very easy to read. Deals with common misconceptions about Jesus and Christianity. You won't be the same after you read this book.

Nine Days to Discover the Joy of Prayer by Jacques Philippe This offers a guided daily way to pray, for people with as little as ten minutes a day to set aside for prayer.

Into Your Hands Father by Wilfrid Stinissen

This book is about how we can stop worrying about everything and start trusting God. What stops us from trusting God and how can this change?

The Screwtape Letters by C.S.Lewis

This is an imagined collection of letters from a senior devil to an apprentice devil, giving him tips on how to distract us from pursuing our Chirstian path. With pointed humour, it helpfully uncovers many of the habits which can lead us away from God.

The Strangest Way: Walking the Christian Path by Bishop Robert Barron

This book focusses on the attitudes of heart and practices we can adopt to become a more authentic Christian.

Making Sense Out of Suffering by Peter Kreeft

Brilliant popular philosopher Peter Kreeft tackles major issues and questions which arise for many due to the presence of suffering in the world and what it says about God. Very readable, Kreeft leads us through different questions and answers about the problem of suffering.

He Leadeth Me by Walter Ciszek

A book about how to trust God no matter the circumstances, written by a Jesuit priest who was imprisoned in a Russian gulag for 20 years.

National Catholic Safeguarding Standards

The ten National Catholic Safeguarding Standards incorporate recommendations from the Royal Commission and also the National Principals for Child Safe Organisations, contextualising these requirements for the Catholic Church in Australia. These standards work in conjunction to ensure every entity, ministry, and organisation across the Catholic Church in Australia places the safety of children and adults at risk at the core of how they plan, think and act. Each week we are discussing one of the ten standards and how they operate in our Parish.

Standard Three: Partnering with Families, Carers and Communities

This standard highlights that Safeguarding occurs in a range of settings. It's parents and carers that are often best placed to inform and advise about the needs of those they care for.

The focus of this standard is to ensure parents and carers take an active role in our safeguarding journey, that they are given information on our governance, policies and practices and also encouraged to contribute and feedback. If you have ideas, feedback or concerns please let your PSSOs know.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
